(The Speaker {**Hon George Ndotto**} entered the Chamber at one minute past 10 O'clock accompanied by the Mace)

(The Speaker recites the prayer and proceeds to the Chair)

(The Mace is placed on the Table)

(The Speaker beckons the Clerk to the podium for consultation before the start of business)

**The Speaker** (Hon Ndotto): Next Order

**The County Assembly Clerk** (Mr Mutambuki): Order No. 1, Administration of oath.

**The Speaker**: Next Order.

**The County Assembly Clerk**: Order No. 2, Communication from the Chair.

**The Speaker**: Next order.

**The County Assembly Clerk**: Order No. 3, Messages.

**The Speaker**: Next order.

**The County Assembly Clerk**: Order No. 4, Petitions.

**The Speaker**: Next Order.

**The County Assembly Clerk**: Order No. 5, Papers (Chairperson-Administration and coordination of County Affairs committee)

**The Speaker**: Honourable Kinyala.

**Hon Kinyala** (The Member for Endau/Malalani ward): Thank you Mr Speaker Sir. I want to lay on the table, the paper(s) on the report by the Administration and Coordination of County Affairs Committee on implementation of the **Community Level Infrastructure Development and Pro-poor** programmes. Mr Speaker, I beg to lay the papers.

*(Hon Kinyala strides to the podium and lays the papers on the table which the Clerk passes over to the Speaker)*

**The Speaker**: Very well. Next order!

**The County Assembly Clerk**: Order No.6, Notices of Motions.

**The Speaker**: Next order.

**The County Assembly Clerk**: Order No.7, Statements.

**The Speaker**: Next order.

**The County Assembly Clerk**: Order No.8, Motion (Chairperson Budget and Appropriation Committee).

**The Speaker**: Honourable Muthui.

**Hon Muthui** (The Member for Matinyani ward): Thank you very much Mr Speaker. Mr Speaker Sir, I would like to move a Motion that the **Kitui County appropriation Bill, 2014, Assembly Bill No. 12, 2014** be read a second time now. Thank you.

*(The Mace is placed in the lower bracket and the Members rise as the Speaker leaves the Chair to allow the House to turn into the committee of the Whole House under the Chairmanship of his deputy hon Mbiti)*

*(But conscious that the Speaker has jumped a step in calling for the order of the proceedings of the business as per the Order Paper, the Clerk immediately strides after him and alerts him of the oversight. In a jiff, the duo re-appears in the Chamber with the Speaker calling for order prompting the Members to rise again as hon Mbiti immediately vacates the Chair while the Sergeant-At-Arms promptly restores the Mace to the upper bracket)*

*(Before resuming the Chair, the Speaker and the Members bow to each other in line with the laid down tradition after which he engages the Clerk in further consultation)*

**The Speaker:** Sorry honourable Members, we had jumped a stage and let's get it right. We go back to Order No.8.

*(The Speaker and the Clerk consult once more)*

**The Speaker:** Honourable Chairman of the Budget (and Appropriation Committee), I think there is something....; you need to move a Motion. Do you have the Motion?

*(Hon Muthui displays a print-out to confirm that he has the Motion)*

**The Speaker:** You have the Motion?

**Hon Muthui:** Yes, I do Mr Speaker Sir.

**The Speaker:** You do

**Hon Muthui:** Yes I do.

**The Speaker:** Can you move it please.

**Hon Muthui:** Mr Speaker Sir, I would like to move a Motion that the **Kitui County Appropriation Bill, 2014, Assembly Bill No. 12, 2014** be now read a second time.

**The Speaker:** Somebody to second?

*(Hon Maundu-the Majority Leader and hon Kililiku-the Member for Kwavonza/Yatta ward reserve their right to speak by rising simultaneously to second the Motion)*

**The Speaker:** Thank you. I will now propose the question that the **Kitui County Appropriation Bill, 2014 (Assembly Bill No. 12, 2014)** be now read a second time.

*(Hon Mutemi rises)*

**The Speaker:** Order! Honourable Mutemi! It is not yet time for debate.

*(The Speaker calls the Clerk to the podium again seeking some clarification)*

**The Speaker:** Honourable Mutemi, what do you want to object to because we are now supposed to turn to the committee of the Whole House!

**Hon Mutemi** (The Member for Kiomo/Kyethani ward): Thank you Mr Speaker Sir for giving me the opportunity (to speak). Mr. Speaker I stand to oppose this Motion because when you look at the Motion, it seeks to fast-track and validate the Budget Estimates whose making process was a fraud and I am on record having stated that and it is the basis on which I am opposed to the document. Mr Speaker, when you look at the Appropriation Bill, it is giving us a block figure yet we need to understand it item by item in line with the Public Finance Management Act. Thus this Motion is seeking to domesticate the very process followed (in coming up with the Budget Estimates) in disregard of the laid down procedure prescribed by the Constitution and the County Government Act. I thus oppose the Motion.

*(Hon Mbiti rises seeking to make a Point of Order)*

*(Foot-thumping by a clique of Members who vigorously opposed adoption of the report on the budget estimates by the House a fortnight ago)*

**The Speaker:** What is your point of order honourable Ndemwa (Mbiti)

**Hon Mbiti** (The Member for Nguutani ward): Thank you Mr Speaker. Mr Speaker is it in order for honourable Mutemi, the Member for Kyethani and my friend to mislead this House? Mr Speaker we are debating on a Motion on the Appropriation Bill but not the Budget (report) Mr Speaker. Thank you.

*(Foot-thumping by the majority of the Members in support of passing of the Budget proposals by the Assembly)*

**Hon Mutemi** (The Member for Kiomo/Kyethani ward): Thank you Mr Speaker. Mr Speaker what I am trying to say is that the Budget (report) is part and parcel of the Appropriation Bill and the latter seeks to fast-track the former which is the reason I have stood to oppose the Motion in its entirety.

**The Speaker:** Order! Order! First of all the Budget (report) was approved by this House.....

*(Foot-thumping)*

**The Speaker:** You are merely accusing the House of being wrong and it is a very serious matter. The Budget has already been approved by the house. Whether you opposed it or you supported it.

*(Foot-thumping)*

**The Speaker:** Once the Budget is approved, you cannot revisit it and say the House did something wrong. Secondly, at this stage, the only thing you can do is to delete the word "now" and put "some other time". There is nothing else you can argue. You cannot stop the Appropriation Bill at this stage. The only thing you can do is to argue that we delete the word "now" and we deal with it later. Thus, you have all the way been wrong honourable Mutemi and therefore I rule you out of order.

*(Foot-thumping)*

**The Speaker:** Now Clerk we move to the next stage. Let me put the question. May I now put the question please, which is that the **Kitui County Appropriation Bill, 2014 (Assembly Bill No. 12, 2014)** be now read a second time.

*As many as are of that opinion say Ayes!*  
**The majority of the Members: Ayes!**  
*As many as are of the contrary opinion say No!*  
**Some Members: No!**

**The Speaker:** The Ayes have it.

*(Foot-thumping)*

*(Once again, the Speaker attempts to leave the Chair to allow for the committee of the Whole House before calling for the next order to facilitate second reading on the Appropriation Bill but the clerk alerts him of the anomaly again)*

**The Speaker:** Yes, I am supposed to call the next order; Next order.

**The Clerk of the County Assembly:** The Kitui County Appropriation Bill, 2014 (Assembly Bill No.12, 2014) second reading.

*(Eventually, the Speaker leaves the Chair to pave way for the committee of the Whole House after the order on the sequence of the proceedings is duly observed. Hon Mbiti takes the Chair)*

**The Chairman:** Order! Honourable Members! Next order!

**The County Assembly Clerk:** Order No. 10, Committee of the whole house. To consider the Kitui County Appropriation Bill, 2014 (Assembly Bill No.12, 2014) - Chairperson, Budget and Appropriations Committee.

**The Chairman:** Honourable members we are in the committee of the whole house and as we know, the rules are relaxed that is why I am allowing honourable Kilonzo to make some consultations, but that does not mean that we are not up to the task. Honourable members we are considering the **Kitui County Appropriation Bill, 2014 (Assembly Bill No.12, 2014)**. I believe you all know the procedure because you are learned members. I will now call upon honourable Muthui (Chairperson, Budget and Appropriations Committee) to lead us. The floor is yours honourable Muthui.

**Hon Muthui:** Thank you very much Mr Chairman. We are now in the committee of the whole house and the rules are rather relaxed. So honourable members you can consult but do it quietly.

Mr Chairman, we are here to consider **the Kitui County Appropriation Bill, 2014 (Assembly Bill No.12, 2014)** and I know want to move straight to the clauses without amendments.

Honourable Members I believe everyone has a copy of the Bill because I want to refer you to the document.

**The Chairman:** Honourable Muthui I request you read from the notice so that we can understand what you are trying to tell us.

**Hon Muthui:** Thank you very much Mr Chairman. Notice is given that the Chairman, Budget and Appropriation Committee intends to move the Adoption by the House of the following clauses and the schedule to the *Kitui County Appropriation Bill, 2014 (Assembly Bill No.12, 2014)* at the committee of the Whole Assembly.

Mr Chairman, I now want to move to the clauses without amendments. Mr Chairman, I want to guide the honourable members in the short title. The Bill you are holding has several pages; page 1 to page 13. Included in the Bill, are some headings that we want to amend. For instance on page two (2) Mr Chairman, the header reads: *The Appropriation Bill, 2014*. Mr Chairman, I want to propose that this header be corrected to read: *The Kitui County Appropriation Bill, 2014*.

I therefore move that the header on top of pages 2, 3, 8, 12 and 13 be amended by inserting the words **Kitui County** in between the words "The" and "Appropriation" so that the header shall read: *The Kitui County Appropriation Bill, 2014*.

I therefore move that those amendments be part of the Bill.

**The Chairman:** Honourable members, I will now propose the question which is that the short title which is the header on top of pages 2, 3,8,12 and 13 be amended by inserting the words **Kitui County** in between the words “The” and “Appropriation”.

**The Chairman:** Honourable members I now put the question which is that the short title which is the header on top of pages 2, 3,8,12 and 13 be amended by inserting the words **Kitui County** in between the words “The” and “Appropriation”.

*As many as are of that opinion say Ayes!*

***The Members: Ayes!***

*As many as are of the contrary opinion say Nay!*

*(Silence)*

**The Chairman:** The Ayes have it. Next honourable Muthui!

**Hon Muthui:** Thank you very much Mr Chairman. I would like to move another motion that, amend the Bill by inserting the Short Title (Header) on top of pages 4, 5, 6, 7, 9, 10, and 11.

That amendment will capture the heading that we have just put, so that each and every page has the heading; *The Kitui County Appropriation Bill, 2014*.

Mr Chairman I beg to move that those amendments be part of the Bill.

**The Chairman:** Honourable members, I will now propose the question which is that amend the Bill by inserting the Short Title (Header) on top of pages 4, 5, 6, 7, 9, 10, and 11 as proposed.

**The Chairman:** Honourable members, I will now put the question which is that amend the Bill by inserting the Short Title (Header) on top of pages 4, 5, 6, 7, 9, 10, and 11 be part of the bill.

*As many as are of that opinion say Ayes!*

***The Members: Ayes!***

*As many as are of the contrary opinion say Nay!*

*(Silence)*

**The Chairman:** The Ayes have it. Next Clerk!

**The County Assembly Clerk:** clause 2 (1).

**The Chairman:** Honourable Muthui.

**Hon Muthui:** Thank you very much Mr Chairman. We now move to clause 2 (1). Clause 2 (1) as printed in the bill, but before we do that I would like to read the whole schedule for the purpose of familiarising. I wish to go through the list so that we refresh our minds.

**The Chairman:** Order honourable Muthui.

**The County Assembly Clerk:** Honourable Members I can see some of us are lost. We are on clause 2 (2) of the Bill not in the Order paper. These are Clauses without amendments and we consider clause by clause as usual.

**Hon Muthui:** Thank you very much Mr Chairman for that correction and guidance. I had skipped a step. Mr Chairman we now go to clause 2 (1) and I would like to move **THAT**, Clause 2 (1) as printed be part of the Bill.

**The Chairman:** Honourable members, I will now propose the question which is **THAT**, Clause 2 (1) as printed be part of the Bill.

**The Chairman:** Honourable members, I now put the question which is **THAT**, Clause 2 (1) as printed, be part of the Bill.

**The Chairman:** Honourable Muthui.

**Hon Muthui:** Thank you very much Mr Chairman. I again wish to move **that**, clause 2 (2) as printed, be part of the Bill.

**The Chairman:** Honourable members, I will now propose the question which is **that**, Clause 2 (2) as printed be part of the Bill.

**The Chairman:** Honourable members, I now put the question which is **that**, Clause 2 (2) as printed be part of the Bill.

*As many as are of that opinion say Ayes!*

**The Members: Ayes!**

*As many as are of the contrary opinion say Nay!*

*(Silence)*

**The Chairman:** The Ayes have it. Next Clerk!

**The County Assembly Clerk:** Thank you Mr Chairman. We are through with the clauses without amendments. We now go to the schedules starting with schedule 1.

**Hon Muthui:** Thank you very much Mr Chairman, we now go straight to the schedules. Mr Chairman I believe every member has a copy of the bill. I want to go through the schedule that is on page 3.

**The Chairman:** Honourable Muthui you will guide us further. Is schedule 1 included in the proposed amendments or it has no amendments?

**Hon. Muthui:** Schedule 1 Mr Chairman has got no amendments.

**The Chairman:** Thank you. Proceed.

**Hon Muthui:** So Mr Chairman we go straight away to page 3 of the schedule. The schedule has four columns. Column 1 has the vote number, column two is the service or purpose, and programmes in column 3 and in column 4 we have the supply or rather the amount. I will now read through the schedule before the chair puts the question. We have two schedules; schedule 1 is on the recurrent expenditure while schedule 2 is on the development.

We are now considering schedule 1 on recurrent expenditure. In this schedule, R stands for recurrent, while P stands for Programme.

*(Hon Kasinga rises on a Point of Order)*

**The Chairman:** Order, Order. What is it honourable Kasinga?

**Hon Kasinga** (The Member for Mumoni): Am getting concerned because it is becoming like a trend. I can see the seats are becoming emptier and emptier. We are discussing a very serious matter and there is a likelihood that some members may later start complaining that we passed the Bill in their absence. I therefore seek the indulgence of the Chair and also for the members who are here to concentrate because we are being drawn back because of issues that actually we should be dealing with them when we are focusing on certain matters. Thank you Mr. Chairman.

**The Chairman:** Honourable Kasinga that is a good concern. I am as well concerned but it is the prerogative of the Member. He knows why he is here; they are honourable Members and should conduct themselves in an honourable manner. The fact that rules are relaxed is not a guarantee for you to do unnecessary things honourable Members. I can as well observe that some honourable Members are not concentrating on what we are doing, so let us follow on what honourable Muthui is guiding us through and let us avoid side shows.

*(Hon Kilonzo rises to contribute)*

**The Chairman:** What is the issue honourable Member for Athi?

**Hon Kilonzo** (The Member for Athi ward): Mr. Chairman, is it in order for the honourable Member from Muumoni to treat the honourable Members as kids being monitored by him?

**The Chairman:** Honourable Kilonzo you are the one who is out of order. Honourable Kasinga is not the one on the floor but it is the chair who is addressing the House. You are behind events.

*(Hon Mwango rises to make a clarification)*

**The Chairman:** What is it the honourable Member for Ikanga?

**Hon Mwango** (The Member for Ikanga): Mr. Chairman I think it is in order for the honourable Members to consult as we proceed with the debate. There are so many issues in the House which makes these Members to consult. They are moving out to consult Mr. Chairman.

**The Chairman:** Agreed honourable Member that is why I said the rules are relaxed but I don't expect this scenario where you engage in the use of personal laptops and reading of newspapers in the House. We are in a serious meeting and if you push me towards that end I will rule it but since we are operating under relaxed rules, I won't rule it. Let us fully concentrate on this matter. It touches on our county and the monies we need for this county. Continue honourable Muthui.

**Hon Muthui:** Thank you very much Mr Chairman and let's proceed.

**The Chairman:** Honourable Muthui I think you should just read the first column and the figures in the fourth column because the members are reading the document.....I don't know if they feel like so.

**Hon Muthui:** Mr Chairman I propose that I read. We are making a Bill and we should not make any assumptions.

**The Chairman:** Awarded. Thank you.

**Hon Muthui:** So let us proceed.
